



## "CONDUCT AFTER CAPTURE" – CAC

---

### Target group:

- Staff of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs (MFA) and individual advisors under contract with the MFA on their way to a posting/duty travel to locations where they may encounter hostile environments. The MFA Security Department (SEK) determines what locations require the completion of a CAC course before departure.
- Members of Denmark's Peace and Stabilisation Response (FSB). FSB participation in CAC is by invitation only, and this course is mandatory before FSB active duty on mission.

### Purpose:

- To give the participants the qualifications to survive captivity with as little as possible physical and psychological damage.

### Content:

Main content during the lecture:

- Basic hostage survival tools and theory
- Stress theory and tools how to handle stress
- Communication and culture

### Form:

- Theoretical course.

- Instructors from the Conduct-After-Capture section / Danish Army
